


## Nothing to Wear?

Don't forget to buy seasonal items, like Easter cards or Christmas decorations, in the days right after the holiday while the prices are slashed and the stock is still available.




## Pump Up!

If you drive to work, don't forget to keep your tires pumped up to their correct pressure.

The engine in a car with under-inflated tires has to work a lot harder.

That means wasted money at the gas pump and a shorter life for your car! Check the label on your tires or look at your car manual: most tires hold 26 to 36 psi. You can buy a cheap pressure gauge or use one at the gas station.
